Harewood Urgent Counselling Walk-in Clinic
Do you sometimes need someone to talk through
something that's really bothering you, but to
someone who is not involved? This free clinic
may prove helpful!

Similar to the Crisis Walk-in Clinic at Brooks Landing, this clinic is open to the general public it operates on Fridays from 4 - 8 p.m. No appointment is necessary. The Harewood Clinic is located at Georgia Avenue Community School, just south of the University Heights mall on Georgia Avenue.

Our goal is to help adult clients turn their crisis/urgent matter into an opportunity for positive change in a single 40 minute session. Clients are welcome to return for another brief session if they wish. Longer-term therapy is available at our office located at #306 - 285 Prideaux Street (where appointments are required).
