### PROGRESS REPORTS

The first of two written report cards will be sent home on Friday February 2. In keeping with the interim reporting order from the Ministry of Education, these reports will include comments as well as a sliding scale from beginning to extending, of student progress at this time of the year. ### REGISTRATION 2018-2019

To register your child in Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools, the online, centralized registration began on January 10, 2018th. The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. Take a moment and ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Is my child new to Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools?
- 2. Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2018 that will be entering Kindergarten?

  Applications must be received by June 15, 2018 to ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.
- 3. Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- 4. Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2018, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2018. Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.
- 5. Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? (Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball, Lacrosse, Baseball, Performing Arts or Jazz) 6. Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of catchment)? Applications are due March 31, 2018. For more information please visit the district website or by emailing

# A SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT GRADE 7 to 8 REGISTRATION

Our Grade 7 students are automatically registered at Cedar Community Secondary for Grade 8, as it is our catchment high school. There is no need to apply. Students wanting to transfer to a secondary school other than our catchment area high school, should apply online. Registration opens January 10th. Out of catchment applications will be prioritized based on time and date stamp of the application as per Administrative Procedure 303 http://bit.ly/studreg303. If you currently live in the catchment area of another high school and your child plans to attend that high school (ie: not Cedar Secondary) please ensure the student

registration process is completed ASAP.

#### LITERACY WEEK

#### PHONING IN ABSENCES

If schools are closed due to snow, or any other weather-related problems, announcements will be made on local radio stations (WOLF 106.9 FM, WAVE 102.3 FM, and 91.7 COAST FM) by 7 a.m. on the day of the closure. Please do not call the radio station – tune in and listen for the announcements, which will be made on a regular basis.

In addition, the district will post the information on the district's website, Twitter, Facebook, and mobile app. Please keep in mind, however, that there may be situations where this is not always possible, for example, power outages or technical problems.
