TRAFFIC



As we are all aware, parking is at a premium and we all need to continue to be diligent to watch for students and other cars.

Staff parking is in the back lot behind the band building. The reason for this is that the road going in and out is only one lane so it is not conducive for drop off and pick up. When parents use this as a drop off area, there is congestion on that road as they try to leave while staff and other parents try to come in. The front parking lot is open for parents who need to park to walk their children to the door. This would be our Kindergarten students when they arrive and some of our grade ones.

Most other students can be dropped off instead of looking for parking. This front lot is a better drop off area as you can drive through, stop for a moment and still leave room for cars to do the same behind you. As long as there are no busses in the bus loop (they arrive around 8:15, 8:20 and 8:33), this is also another safe drop off area. Please drive to the far end - the second bus gate - in case a bus does arrive or to give other families the same opportunity.

Supervision is provided in the yard for 15 minutes before and after school. The upper parking lot is quite empty about 10 minutes after school so another option is to arrange to meet your child a few minutes after dismissal. Students still on the yard after the busses leave will wait at the office for their ride.

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As we have students and staff in our school with peanut allergies, please be aware of the food you are sending in and avoid peanuts specifically. We want our school to be a safe place for all. If your child has a new allergy alert, please let the office know immediately as there are medical forms that need to be completed and a place to leave emergency prescription medication.

Here are some suggestions for nut free snacks:

- Fruit or assorted vegetables
- Dried fruit like raisins
- Cheese and certain crackers or rice cakes
- Pretzels, breadsticks, muffins (check ingredients)
- Yogurt or other milk products
- Homemade popcorn

Please check the labels to be sure!

STUDENT VERIFICATION FORMS

Please look for these important forms that will be sent home this week. We ask that you complete them as thoroughly as possible and return them to school as quickly as possible so that we have the necessary safety contacts and medical information on file for your child. It is very important that we have two alternate numbers to call in case your child is sick or there is an emergency. Please remember if your child requires any medication at school (e.g. inhalers, epipen, antibiotics) there is a form that needs to be filled out by the parents/guardians. All medication needs to be kept in the office.

The emergency contact form is for the school to keep in a binder that comes out for fire and earthquake drills. If we were to have a real emergency, this is the place we would look for phone numbers and the people you want to pick up your children. Please fill this out carefully. The third sheet is two sided and contains all the permissions we need for the school year as well as information on applying for your criminal records check - needed to volunteer in the school.

SCHOOL VISITATION PROTOCOL

In keeping with our District's Health and Safety policies and good practice, we ask that all visitors check in with the office. If you are volunteering in a classroom or in any other area of our school, or are dropping off something for a student, we ask that you sign in at the office and pick up an 'Authorized Visitor' badge. This also helps us to know who is in our building in the event of an emergency.

BUS PASSES

Bus Passes have been distributed but there are still more to come. If your child did not get one yet and you have registered, it should be here next week. If you have not registered, please register through the transportation link on the school district website.
