PHONING IN ABSENCES

Cold and flu season is upon us! In order to prevent the spread of germs, please remind your children to wash their hands regularly. Vancouver Island Health Authority also recommends keeping your child at home for 48 hours after symptoms subside if they have been vomiting. If your child is ill and going to be away from school, just phone the office and we'll be sure to excuse them for the day. Voice mail is available all day so parents can call any time to report students who will be absent or late. This program is for the safety of your child. *All absences and lates need to be called in.*



AFTER SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS

We request that you make after school arrangements for your children in advance, and they know if there are different plans for the day. Please send a note for the teacher if someone else will be picking up your student or if they are going home with a friend. If your child takes the bus and wants to get off at another stop with a friend or take a friend home, the bus driver needs a written note in order to make those changes. We understand that emergencies arise and that there are times when plans need to be quickly adjusted and we are happy to pass on messages in these situations. However, due to the busy nature of the classroom and the office, we appreciate it when plans can occur outside of school time. This allows learning to take place with the fewest interruptions.
