REGISTRATION 2019-2020

A SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT GRADE 8 REGISTRATIONS

Grade 7 students are automatically registered and scheduled at Cedar Secondary for Grade 8, as Cedar is our catchment high school. There is no need to apply to Cedar Secondary as this is automatically taken care of for your child. Students wishing to transfer to a secondary school other than our catchment area high school, should notify their Principal and Grade 7 teacher and apply online. District Secondary Academy Applications will be accepted between January 9 and March 1, 2019. Applications must be completed and received by Central Registration by March 1, 2019. Applications that are not fully completed will not be considered for entrance to the program. Acceptance into an Academy may be contingent on a students' record of behaviour and attendance in the past school year.

ALL OTHER REGISTRATIONS

To register your child in Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools, the online, centralized registration began on January 9, 2019. The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. Take a moment and ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. Is my child new to Nanaimo-Ladysmith Public Schools?
- 2. Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2019 that will be entering Kindergarten?

 Applications must be received by June 15, 2019 to ensure a placement in your child's catchment-area school.
- 3. Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- 4. Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2019, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2019. Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.

We celebrate literacy every day but draw special attention to it in January.

PHONING IN ABSENCES

SCHOOL CLOSURES

If schools are closed due to snow, or any other weather-related problems, announcements will be made on local radio stations (WOLF 106.9 FM, WAVE 102.3 FM, and 91.7 COAST FM) by 7 a.m. on the day of the closure. Please do not call the radio station - tune in and listen for the announcements, which will be made on a regular basis.

In addition, the district will post the information on the district's website, Twitter, Facebook, and mobile app. Please keep in mind, however, that there may be situations where this is not always possible, for example, power outages or technical problems. The most reliable method is to listen to the local radio stations.
