BUS PASSES

Bus Passes have been distributed but if your child did not get one yet and you have registered, it should be here soon. Students can ride the bus without the pass for the next couple of weeks until they are all delivered.

TERRY FOX RUN

We are running on the afternoon of Sept 26! Students in grades K-3 or in upper grades who are not comfortable with the road distance will run on the field. Students in grades 4-7 who have returned the walk/run off school grounds permission slip will run the route on the road. Parents are needed to help supervise at corners and pass out oranges.

SCHOOL VISITATION PROTOCOL

In keeping with our District's Health and Safety policies and good practice, we ask that all visitors check in with the office. If you are volunteering in a classroom or in any other area of our school, or are dropping off something for a student, we ask that you sign in at the office and pick up an 'Authorized Visitor' badge. This also helps us to know who is in our building in the event of an emergency.

TRAFFIC



As we are all aware, parking is at a premium and we all need to continue to be diligent to watch for students and other cars.

The entrance to the back lot was widened this summer after the bus loop exit. The plan is that you enter that lot through the bus loop so the entrance and exit are one way. The front parking lot is open for parents who need to park to walk their children to the door. This would be our Kindergarten students when they arrive and some of our grade ones.

Most other students can be dropped off instead of looking for parking. This front lot is a better drop off area as you can drive through, stop for a moment and still leave room for cars to do the same behind you. As long as there are no busses in the bus loop (they arrive around 8:15, 8:20 and 8:25), this is another safe drop off area. Please drive to the far end - the second bus gate - in case a bus does arrive or to give other families the same opportunity.

Supervision is provided in the yard for 15 minutes before and after school. The upper parking lot is quite empty about 10 minutes after school so another option is to arrange to meet your child a few minutes after dismissal. Students still on the yard after the busses leave will wait at the office for their ride.



DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

We live in a rainy fall/winter climate, and we go outside at short and long recess. Please be sure your child has a raincoat or jacket

with a hood. If your child only has one pair of shoes, he or she may be wet all day as those puddles are tempting. Please send an extra set of clothing including sock and mitts that your child can keep in their locker or cubby. These are very helpful for those other days when "accidents" happen and the bathroom is just too far away.



STUDENT VERIFICATION FORMS

Please look for these important forms that will be sent home this week. We ask that you complete them as thoroughly as possible and return them to school as quickly as possible so that we have the necessary safety contacts and medical information on file for your child. It is very important that we have two alternate numbers to call in case your child is sick or there is an emergency. Please remember if your child requires any medication at school (e.g. inhalers, epipen, antibiotics) there is a form that needs to be filled out by the parents/guardians. All medication needs to be kept in the office.

The emergency contact form is for the school to keep in a binder that comes out for fire and earthquake drills. If we were to have a real emergency, this is the place we would look for phone numbers and the people you want to pick up your children. Please fill this out carefully. The third sheet is two sided and contains all the permissions we need for the school year as well as information on applying for your criminal records check - needed to volunteer in the school.

ORANGE SHIRT DAY

Cedar Elementary will observe **ORANGE SHIRT DAY** on Monday, Sept 30 to honour the survivors of the Indian Residential School System and remember those who did not. The reason we wear orange is based on the real life story of Phyllis, a survivor of St. Joseph Mission School in Williams Lake, BC, whose brand new orange shirt was taken from her on her first day when she was just a little girl.

ANIMALS IN SCHOOL SETTINGS

Our district has an administrative procedure regarding animals in school settings. There have been an increasing number of pets walking their owners to school so we are posting this as a reminder to leave them at home.

The Board of Education believes that a safe environment free of animals is desirable for its students and employees.

Animals, including all pets, should not be kept or brought onto school properties, into schools or district facilities. The presence of animals presents many problems which include safety and liability issues. It is strongly encouraged that any animals found inside a school or district facility or on school grounds be removed immediately.

Classrooms projects where animals are included or long term education-focused exhibits may be excluded at this time, with principal approval.
