PHONING IN ABSENCES

Cold and flu season is upon us! In order to prevent the spread of germs, please remind your children to wash their hands regularly. Vancouver Island Health Authority also recommends keeping your child at home for 48 hours after symptoms subside if they have been vomiting. If your child is ill and going to be away from school, just phone the office and we'll be sure to excuse them for the day. Voice mail is available all day so parents can call any time to report students who will be absent or late. This program is for the safety of your child. *All absences and lates need to be called in*.



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FOOD DRIVE

Our **Food Drive** starts Monday, Nov. 25 in each classroom. Grade 7 volunteers will collect the food from each room and keep track of donations. We are looking for non-perishables. We will also collect donations at the concert. All of our donations stay in our community and all contributions, big or small, are appreciated.



WINTER CONCERT

We have two showings of our Concert each year due to the number of students. Because of this, we will need to issue tickets that are collected at the door. Fire regulations set the number of people allowed in the gym at one time as 525 people; with 350 students, we are unable to have only one show with each student inviting two guests. Instead, we will have 2 shows. Performances will be on Dec. 11th at 12:45 and 6:30 PM.

Ticket request forms are given to the youngest in the family and will come home starting November 20. If you do not receive this, please check the backpack or give the school a call. We realize more than 2 people may want to see these performances so additional requests for more tickets can be made Dec 3. Please send it in writing so the tickets can be attached to the request. We have been able to meet additional requests in the past. Everyone who wishes to attend MUST have a ticket - these are not just extras. You will be asked for your ticket at the performance so please remember to bring it with you. The afternoon and evening shows are the same - the dress rehearsal is in the morning. The dress rehearsal is also open to those who can't make either performance but all the students will be watching and there is stopping and starting so it lasts a little longer! It looks like a spectacular show!

SCHOOL CLOSURES

If schools are closed due to snow, or any other weather-related problems, announcements will be made on local radio stations (WOLF 106.9 FM, WAVE 102.3 FM, and 91.7 COAST FM) by 7 a.m. on the day of the closure.
